1. Introduction: -

1.1 Master of Science in Pharmaceutical Medicine-

The discipline of Pharmaceutical Medicine concerns the medical and healthcare aspects of research, development, evaluation, registration, monitoring, and marketing of medicines and healthcare-related products. It is widely recognized that pharmaceutical products play a critical role in health care, promoting health, relieving symptoms, providing cures and offering palliation.

The Master of Science (Pharmaceutical Medicine) Program at the Maharashtra University of Health Sciences (MUHS) provides an excellent opportunity for graduates in the Health Sciences, including Alternative systems of Medicine, Ayurveda, Unani, Homeopathy, Pharmacy, and Basic Sciences to pursue a challenging and rewarding career contributing to the development of biologicals, herbals, nutraceuticals, devices to health promotion.

The MUHS initiated the Master of Science (Pharmaceutical Medicine) Program in 2006, with a curriculum revision in 2012 and 2023. Since its inception, students have successfully completed the program, and these alumni have established successful careers in academia and industry both in India and abroad.

As our world evolves and progresses, it is important for us to keep up with the changes in healthcare, regulations, and education policy. Curriculum revision ensures alignment with evolving healthcare, regulatory and educational landscapes, enhancing student's skills and job readiness. PROGRAM SCOPE:

The program is designed to accommodate students with diverse backgrounds, including health sciences, pharmacy and basic life sciences. The program provides an environment that will motivate, enlighten and train students for various challenging careers as professionals in clinical research, regulatory affairs, pharmacovigilance, medical writing, drug development entrepreneurship and related fields.

Syllabus & Rules for Entrance Examination.

Multiple-Choice Questions (M.C.Q.) shall be based on **the Basic Concepts of Health Sciences, Pharmacy National health policies and health programs, General Knowledge / Current Affairs**

Students have to appear for objective type Common Entrance Examination. (CET)

- Details of Date of Examination, Time & Venue shall be informed on Hall ticket provided for CET.
Hall ticket will be issued online to eligible candidates on their email address provided by them.
- Language of entrance examination shall be English.
- The examination shall consist of Multiple-choice Question paper of 100 marks containing 50 questions, -and duration of examination shall be one and half hour (90 minutes).
- The candidate will be required to mark the correct answer by black / blue ball point pen in the given Objective Answer Sheet (OMR Sheet).
- Each correct answer will be given two marks. There shall be no negative marking.
- Scratching, overwriting, multiple answers will be considered as wrong answer and no marks will be allotted to them.

11.1 Common Entrance Test (Screening Test) for Postgraduate Courses

Overview:

A common objective-type CET (screening test) will be conducted to shortlist applicants for all postgraduate courses.

The Basic Concepts of Health Sciences, Pharmacy, National health policies and health programs, General Knowledge / Current Affairs

Examination Details:

- **Type:** Multiple Choice Questions (MCQ)
- **Language:** English
- **Marks:** 100 (50 questions, 2 marks per question)
- **Duration:** 1.5 hours
- **Marking:**
 - Use a black or blue ballpoint pen to mark answers.
 - No negative marking.
 - Scratching, overwriting, or multiple answers will be marked as incorrect.

11.2. Hall Tickets Distribution:

- Eligible candidates will receive their hall tickets online via email. Hall tickets will include the Examination Date, Time, and Venue.

12. Merit List Preparation for Provisional Admissions

➤ Common Entrance Test (Screening Test) Merit List:

- A merit list will be generated based on the scores of Candidates who appear for the Common Entrance Test (Screening Test). This merit list will be used for the Provisional admission process.

➤ Tie-Breaking Criteria:

In case of a tie in the Entrance Examination scores, the following criteria will be used to determine merit:

- **First Level:** The candidate's score in the Entrance Examination.
- **Second Level:** The candidate's aggregate marks in SSC (converted to percentage up to two decimal points).
- **Third Level:** If the tie still persists, the older candidate will be given preference over the younger candidate.

13. Selection Process: -

- At the time of admission to the respective study center the Candidate should bring all original documents and two set of attested copies of the same in support of claim made in application form i.e. Caste Certificate, Caste Validity Certificate, and Non-Creamy Layer Certificate.
- **The students admitted in first round will have to submit retention form to respective study center for confirmation of their admission.**
- **There is no need of submission of retention form by the admitted students during second & subsequent round.**

CONDUCT AND DISCIPLINE:

- a) Failure of the candidate in making full and correct statements in the application form and / or suppression of any information would lead to disqualification of the candidate, even at later date. Such a Candidate will be debarred from the entire selection process.

14. Disqualification for Admission:

Candidates will be disqualified from admission under the following circumstances:

- **Prior PG Admission:** Candidates already admitted to a postgraduate course in another subject or faculty are ineligible.
- **Admission Cancellation/ Non-Admission:** Selected Candidates who cancel their admission or fail to complete the admission process within the specified period will be ineligible for future admissions.
- **Document Submission Failure:** Candidates who do not submit the required documents as listed in point 10(3) will be ineligible.
- **False or Incomplete Statements:** Candidates who provide false or incomplete information in their Application will be disqualified.

15. Attendance Requirement: - A minimum of 80% attendance is mandatory. Students failing to meet this requirement will be ineligible to appear for examinations.

- Absence due to illness must be supported by a valid Medical Certificate.

16. Stipend Information

- No stipend will be provided for these programs.

17. Accommodation

- Accommodation M.Sc Pharmaceutical Medicine Program students can be made available on request in the university campus for other programs students are responsible for arranging their own accommodation.



18. Program Conduct

- **Full-Time Attendance:** Candidates admitted to full-time programs/courses are required to attend the institute for the entire duration of the working day. The M.Sc. Pharmaceutical Medicine program will utilize a blended learning approach.
- **Prohibition of Concurrent Employment:** Candidates enrolled in these programs/courses are prohibited from working at any other institution or engaging in medical practice, either part-time or full-time.
- **Disciplinary Action:** Students found engaging in anti-national activities, unlawful activities, or ragging during their studies will be expelled from the program/course by the competent authority.
- **Document Responsibility:** Students are responsible for maintaining and possessing all necessary documentation.
- **Course Completion Duration:** The maximum duration for completing the program/course after registration is four (4) years, including any permissible gaps and attempts.

19. Degree Certificates

19.1 Master of Science in Pharmaceutical Medicine:

- Upon successful program completion, Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik, will award the "Master of Science in Pharmaceutical Medicine" degree.

19.2 MBA (Health Care Administration):

- 2) Provided that in case any seat in this 5% quota remains unfilled on account of unavailability of candidates with locomotor disability of lower limbs between 50% to 70% then any such unfilled seat in this 5% quota shall be filled up by persons with locomotor disability of lower limbs between 40% to 50% - before they are included in the annual sanctioned seats of State Quota.
